Western Europe's Last Word to Russia.

Entente Reaches Limit of Concessions—Genoa Conference World's Greatest Political Conclave—Council of Irish Catholic Bishops Approve Treaty—Recriminations Between Opposing Leaders in Dail.

ITAL WORD TO RUSSIA.
GENOA, April 27. French, Italian and Belgium have reached an agreement on the concessions they are willing to make to Russia, and these will be made to-morrow. The delegates to the agreement represents Western Europe's proposals to Soviet Russia and sets forth what Russia has to offer Western Europe in exchange.

WHAT EVENTS PENDING.
GENOA, April 27. Representatives of the big and little nations of Europe are expected to meet before them in form to-day, and to be presented to the delegates in answer to their proposals, which the Allies had unacceptable. Meanwhile the Genoa Conference has developed into one of the most important world conclaves in history. The German Treaty, which may be signed as the forerunner of a peace between the two mightiest nations in Europe from the standpoint of population, has been followed by other political developments, and the proposed summoning of the League of Nations signatories to the measures to be adopted if they do not meet her war responsibilities.

CATHOLIC BISHOPS FOR THE TREATY.
DUBLIN, April 27. Catholic Bishops at a meeting which took place yesterday issued the following statement: "Nothing but the peace and solid virtue of the people has saved us from the anarchy and civil war. Unfortunately the general public can up to now look on with helpless anguish at everything dear to them in the order, life, property and nationality, is being hacked to pieces by military in contentions. Like the great bulk of the people we think the best and wisest way for Ireland is to accept the peace and make the most of the free-

Emam De Valera asked Griffith to extricate him from "the straight jacket of the Republic." Mr. De Valera described this as a lie and turmoil followed. Mr. De Valera demanded that Griffith's allegation be sifted by a Judicial Committee. Michael Collins announced that the full correspondence would be published.

SOVIET APPROVES.
MOSCOW, April 27. The Soviet Government has sent a wireless message to Foreign Minister Tchitcherin in Genoa embodying a resolution of approval of the Russian delegates' policy at the Economic Conference and giving instructions that no concessions be granted the Allies which would interfere with the rights or the political freedom of the Russian workers.

BERLIN, April 27.
The German Foreign Office in a statement to the Associated Press emphasizes that the Russo-German Treaty, signed at Rapallo, on Easter Sunday, contains no secret clauses as charged in some quarters. The Treaty has been published in its entirety, the statement says. It is not of military or political character, being entirely of an economic nature.

ALWAYS KNOWN TO NEWFOUNDLANDERS.
OTTAWA, April 27. Investigation under the auspices of the Honorary Advisory Council for scientific and industrial research has disclosed that the pink and red discoloration of green, salted, cured or dried codfish on the Atlantic Coast is due to the salt used in curing. The discoloration affected the market value of the product sometimes as much as forty per cent. of the output. Experiments showed that the sea salt usually employed contained organisms causing discoloration and that if no others are available the salts should be sterilized by heating in a kiln at the temperature of boiling water for thirty minutes. Otherwise minced salts should be used. Establishments in which sea salt have been used should be disinfected by steam and the utensils washed with fresh water.

PAPER STRIKE POSSIBLE.
NEW YORK, April 27. Only four days in which to negotiate a new wage contract before the present one expires remained when the officers of the International Brotherhood of Paper Makers met with the newspaper manufacturers here to-day in an effort to avert a threatened strike of sixty thousand men.

REPUBLICANS EVACUATE MULLINGAR.
MULLINGAR, April 27. Free State troops gained control of the town following the morning fighting. At three o'clock this afternoon, the Free State Commander issued an ultimatum ordering the regulars to leave in five hours and at eight tonight they left.

SHIPS OUT HAVE 2,400.
The sealing ships on second trips have not done much during the past few days. The Seal, Ranger and Thetis, the only ships out report for total of 2,400, so that with the 114,875 landed the total in sight is 117,275. Last night Capt. W. Winsor of S.S. Thetis reported that his crew had taken 700 old seals during the day. Capt. Jacob Kean of S.S. Seal reported yesterday that his ship was still jammed. S.S. Ranger is about 15 miles East of Cape John, and owing to weather conditions during the past three days nothing has been done.
