DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

Sir Francis Hincks then spoke in defence of the Government. He is known to have been the most vehement opponent of the Treaty, but, as in the case of his celebrated national policy surrender, he has turned his back on himself; and yesterday, during a speech of an hour and a half, limped and blundered in a slow and embarrassed fashion through quotations from speeches delivered in the House of Lords and other scraps of comfort he could find to justify his own tergiversation.

THE WASHINGTON TREATY

MR. GLADSTONE'S EXPLANATIONS

A Satisfactory Solution of the Difficulty

LOS ANGELES, May 13. — In the House of Commons this evening, Mr. Gladstone made his promised explanation of the state of the negotiations regarding the indirect claims, and of the position taken by the Government.

Mr. Gladstone on rising was greeted with cheers. He said that in order to allow an opportunity for discussion on the statements he was about to make he would bring a formal motion, for the adjournment of the House.

Mr. Fish's despatch was most courteous. In the meantime a communication was received from General Schenck, the American Minister, suggesting another course that would be acceptable to England and America.
