

The Lennox Victory. Nearly two-thirds of the elector of Lennox have declared by their vote that a "Conservative" in Lennox does not mean "a blind follower of a corrupt party leader.' Sir John A. There was no defence, and the Murillo was ordered to be sold for the benefit of the Northfleet's






