[Canadian Press Cable.] PARIS, June 22.—An official statement issued tonight contains the folowing regarding aviation: "In reprisal for the successive bom-ardments carried out by the Germans

On the night of June 21-22 eighteen shells were dropped on the town of Treves, where a great fire broke out. Today a flo-tilla of nine aeroplanes dropped 40 shells on Karlsruhe (175 kilometres from Nancy). Another group of ten aeroplanes set out to bombard Mul-helm (on the right bank of the Rhine). Fifty shells were dropped on the miliary establishments at that town.






