Its hydro-electric rates have declined since 1913 from 5.4 cents to 3.3 cents per kilowatt hour for domestic lighting, and from 5.4 cents to 2.2 cents for commercial. The load has increased from 114.5 to 249.5 horsepower.

The revenue for 1921 was \$18.044.35. After placing to plant renewal reserve \$708, and meeting interest, sinking fund and all ordinary expenditures, there was a net surplus of \$3,014.80—cquivalent to \$8.52 per horsepower on the 1921 load. The assets are \$28.840.41; the liabilities stand at \$10.975.80; the reserves and surplus at \$17.864.61. 
