Briefly, for some twenty years not a mint in Europe has been open to the coinage of silver for individual owners of that metal, except in the case of some special pieces resembling our former trade dollar.

The men in the United States who for purposes of their own are endeavoring to foist upon their country a metal currency which is intrinsically worth less than it purports to be, must for a precedent go back to the unscrupulous European governments which deliberately debased the coinage in order to cheat the people under their jurisdiction.

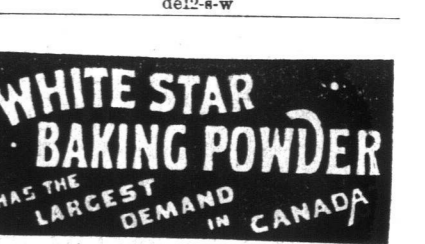
