

this year show an increase of \$120,000
over the same period of last year, the
totals being \$263,904.58 and \$143,761.

MAY TAX CANADIAN
NATIONAL RAILWAYS
As the result of a conference Wed-
nesday morning at the Executive
Council Chamber, participated in by

Provincial Government, and Gerald
G. Ruel, general solicitor of the C. N.
R. and Thomas G. Watson, another
C. N. R. official, it was said that the

FOREST TRAVEL CERTIFICATES

Will be required by all persons and parties entering upon forest
land of New Brunswick, except licensees, or owners of the lands en-
tered upon, their employees, fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors,
holders of hunting, fishing, guides or mining licenses, or persons ac-
companied by registered guides, Clergymen, Teachers, Pupils accom-
panied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts.

Help Save the Forests!

Certificates may be secured from local Fire Wardens, County
Councils, Game License Vendors, or other persons authorized. The
same persons are authorized to issue applications as in 1924.
Name, route, destination, purpose and duration of trip, together
with dates, will be required for registration purposes before cer-
tificates can be issued to applicants. Persons should register with the
Fire Warden nearest the woods in which he desires to travel.
Penalties for non-compliance, not less than \$10, and not more than
\$100.

SNOW IN WOODS
Two feet of snow in the woods in the
vicinity of the interprovincial bound-
ary between Quebec and New Brun-
swick, was reported Saturday by Geo.
F. Burden, of the staff of the Depart-
ment of Lands and Mines, who has
returned from an official visit to
Northern New Brunswick.

Mr. Burden said that the rivers in
that vicinity were quite high and that
rivermen feared heavy freshets would
result from the rains of the week
coupled with the presence of so much
snow in the woods, particularly in
the event of the weather becoming
warmer. Driving operations have
been commenced in the northern sec-
tions of the province, while on the
Tobique the drives of the Fraser
Companies, Ltd., are nearly all out.
The snow which was reported was
still firm in the swamps and able to
support the weight of men making
their way through the woods.

FIRST AID FOR THE SHOCKED
Electric shocks are becoming so
numerous, due to the increasing use
of electricity in all walks of life, that
first aid organizations are emphasizing
safely measures in giving relief.
Where the shock is obviously too
great to allow for human contact to
assist the victim, a nonconductor
such as rubber gloves, a dry wood
stick or dry clothes can be used safely.
If it is necessary to cut a wire the
safest way is to use a hatchet or axe
with a wood handle that is dry and
to turn the face away to avoid the
flash that might ruin the sight.
