



THE BANK OF TORONTO.

Proceedings of the Twenty-Seventh Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders, held at the Banking House of the Institution in Toronto, on Wednesday, 20th June, 1888.

The annual general meeting of the Bank of Toronto (being the twenty-seventh since the commencement of business) was held in pursuance of the terms of the charter, at the banking house of the institution, June 20, 1888.

On motion of Alex. T. Paton, Esq., George Gooderham, Esq., president, was called to the chair.

Moved by W. R. Waterworth, Esq., seconded by W. G. Gooderham, Esq., and Resolved, that Mr. Walter S. Lee and Mr. E. S. Cox be appointed scrutineers to receive the votes of the stockholders for the election of directors for the ensuing year...

The Directors of the Bank of Toronto in submitting their twenty-seventh annual statement have much pleasure in reporting to the stockholders the increased prosperity of the Bank.

The net profits compare favorably with former years, and the directors have been enabled to declare a bonus of two per cent, in addition to dividends amounting to eight per cent, per annum, and to place a considerable sum to rest.

After making full provision for losses as usual, and for contingencies, the directors have decided to declare a dividend of four per cent, on the paid-up capital of the bank, amounting to the sum of \$1,182,000.

This sum has been appropriated as follows: Dividend No. 55, 4 per cent, \$450,000; Dividend No. 56, 4 per cent, \$450,000; Added to rest, \$282,000; Balance carried forward from last year, \$1,182,000.

The Directors in advertising to the increased distribution of profits made in this year have to observe that they desire with great caution in this direction, owing to a continuance of the property of recent years being so much a matter of uncertainty.

The activity in every branch of business, produced by large exports of lumber and timber, grain, cattle, and dairy products, together with the heavy expenditures on public works, railways, and new manufacturing enterprises, has resulted in increased profits, but the experience of former years admonishes the Directors to avoid undue expansion that in time is certain to be followed by a reaction.

The board have pleasure in again testifying to the zealous manner in which the officers of the Bank have discharged their respective duties.
