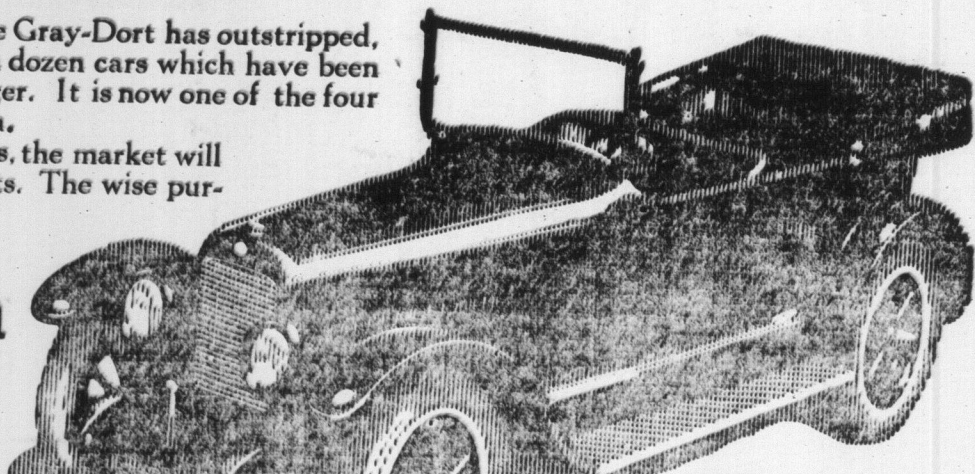

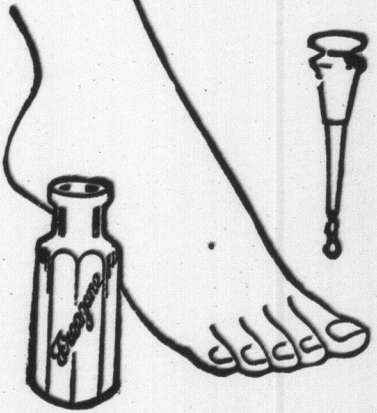

### FACTS THOUGH FISHY

The world's annual catch of herring is estimated at 3,000,000,000 or approximately half that number of pounds.  
The prolificacy of the procreation of sea creatures may be surprising to many. A herring, for example, delivers an average of 30,000 eggs with a maximum of 55,000.  
Considering weight, the cod fishery is the most productive in Canada, but salmon fishery is by far the most valuable from a monetary viewpoint.  
The standard packing of pickled herring, mackerel, alewives, salmon, made necessary by recent legislation, should increase the price of these articles in foreign markets.

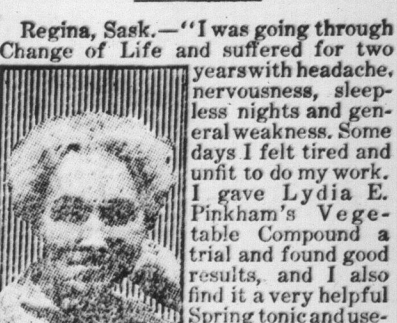
