As will be observed, the chief cause of rejection arises from imperfect family history and alcoholism, and a glance at the death column will show how requisite it is to be guarded in these respects. To protect the Associa-tion against an imperfect membership is a matter which concerns all alike.

The Medical Examiners can but speak of the physical condition of an appli cant. His habits of life and his family history may be entirely unknown to him. Where such is the case the responsibility of action rests with the branch officers, and their hearty coperation should be extended to the Medical Examiners, that we may secure a healthy and vigorous membership. The death rate of late has been unusually heavy. Since the Grand Secretary closed his books for our last convention one hundred and seventy-three of our brothers have passed away.
