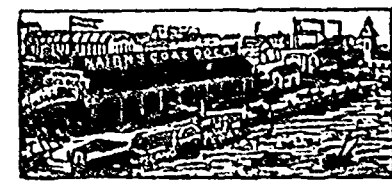

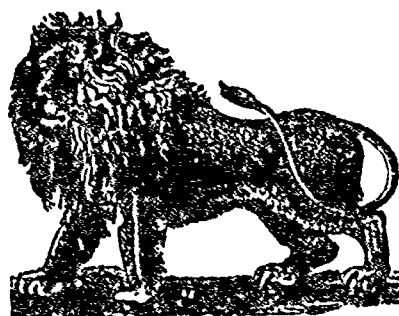

## Woman's Medical College, Toronto

The trustees of the Toronto General Hospital have very kindly made special arrangements for the accommodation of lady students. A gallery for the sole use of the latter has been erected in the operating theatre, and every provision has been made for securing their comfort and convenience while pursuing their clinical studies. The college building is situated immediately opposite the General Hospital, an advantage readily appreciable in cases of accident or other emergency. It contains commodious lecture, waiting and dissecting rooms, laboratory, etc., and is amply equipped with the necessary chemical, physiological and pathological apparatus.

Board may be obtained in the vicinity of the College at rates as low as in any other city. Intending students can undergo their matriculation examination subsequent to their entrance upon lectures in the School.
