Local Market Report.

The harvest is now well advanced, and all indications go to show that any fear of damage is passed. Reports from the country are most gratifying, and the crop reports much in excess of earlier estimates. Following may be taken as the ruling prices for farmer's produce:

Wheat—This is about the cheapest grain on the market. Very little business was done last week. No. 1 hard wheat is 60c in about the average. No. 2, 59c to 60c. Corn—Quotations are about equal to No. 2 wheat, there is a better demand though. Flour—Quotations in broken lots: Patents, \$1.55; strong baker's, \$1.45. Low grades, 75c to \$1, as to quantity. These prices are per sack of 48 pounds. Oats—32c to 34c per bushel. Barley—40 to 45c per bushel. Butter—12 1/2 to 15c for good to choice. Cheese—8 1/2 to 9c jobbers selling at 10c. Poultry—Turkeys 14c per lb. 10c for live weight. Spring chickens 30c to 35c per pair. Vegetables—Onions 3 1/2 lb. cabbage, 40c doz. peas in pod \$1 bushel. Cauliflower, 75c doz., celery 25c doz. radishes, 10c doz., turnips 15c bunch, green corn 12 1/2 to 15c dozen ears. The above prices are for large quantities.

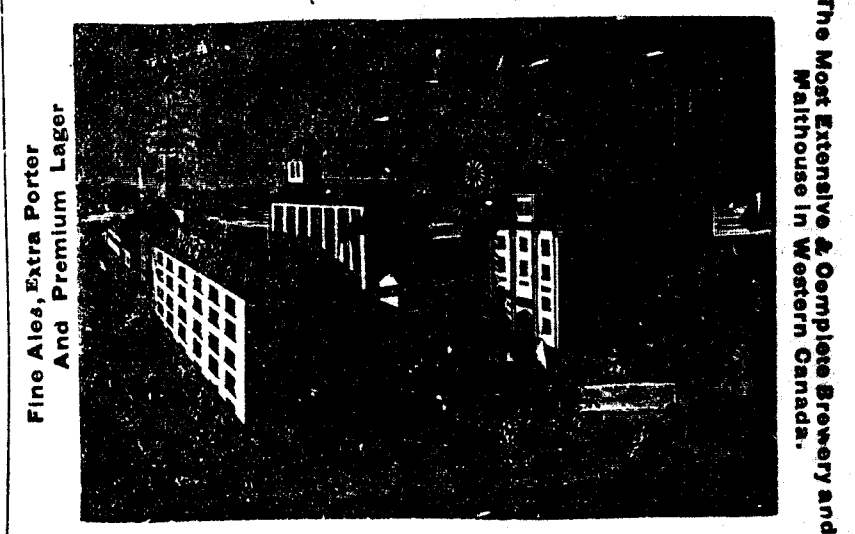
