

O'DELL v. CITY OF LONDON—BROWNLEE v. CITY OF LONDON—
MIDDLETON, J., IN CHAMBERS—MAY 10.

Particulars—Statement of Claim—Negligence—Discovery.]—An application was made by the defendants in each case, to the Master in Chambers, for an order for particulars of the negligence alleged in the statement of claim. The Master dismissed the applications without prejudice to renewal after examinations for discovery. The defendants appealed from the Master's order to MIDDLETON, J., in Chambers. The learned Judge, in a brief memorandum, said that, on consideration, he agreed with the Master that orders for particulars at this stage would be oppressive and improper.
