- 3) The 1987 edition of Surviving the nuclear age: a bibliography on nuclear weapons, arms control and disarmament a comprehensive English-language bibliography starting from 1945; the Table of Contents of the entire bibliography was also published.
- 4) Peace and security bookshelf annual bibliographies of current Canadian materials of general interest, to be used as a selection aid for winners of the Bookshelf Grant, although it is freely available to others.

Outreach

Information Services staff organized displays as part of *La Semaine de la Paix* at the University of Montreal, and the *UN Disarmament Week* in Quebec City. An arrangement of Institute publications was complemented by a sampling of other peace and security resource materials.

The Institute continues to be actively involved in the Canadian Library Association's Peace and Security Interest Group. At the June 1990 annual conference, we organized a workshop entitled *Information Resources in the Field of Peace and Security*, as well as staffing a booth at the conference which contained a display of Institute publications. In early 1991, as follow-up to the 1989 workshop, the Interest Group wrote and submitted a report to the Department of National Defence on the accessibility of that department's publications to Canadian libraries.

The Bookshelf Grant programme was expanded this year to include secondary school libraries as well as public libraries. Grants were no longer offered to particular libraries,

rather the grant offer was opened up to any interested library within the specified categories. The sum of the grant was also reduced to \$500, making it possible to award a greater number. In all, the Institute distributed sixty-five \$500 Bookshelf Grants to public and secondary school libraries which wished to develop their collections in the area of international peace and security from a Canadian perspective.
