PRAYERS.

The House resumed debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Chaplin, seconded by Mr. Vincent,—That the following Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor-General of Canada:

To His Excellency Major-General George P. Vanier, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom has been conferred the Military Cross and the Canadian Forces' Decoration, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:

We, Her Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, the House of Commons of Canada, in Parliament assembled, beg leave to offer our humble thanks to Your Excellency for the gracious Speech which Your Excellency has addressed to both Houses of Parliament.

And on the proposed motion of Mr. Pearson, seconded by Mr. Chevrier, in amendment thereto,—That the following be added to the Address:

"We respectfully affirm to Your Excellency that Your Excellency's advisers do not possess the confidence of this House."

And debate continuing;

Mr. Lewis, seconded by Mr. Barnett, moved in amendment to the said proposed amendment,—That the amendment be amended by inserting therein immediately after the word "advisers" the words "having failed to propose a program of economic planning, designed to bring about economic growth and full employment".
