#### PRIVILEGE—MR. BUREAU.

On the Orders of the Day:

Mr. JACQUES BUREAU (Three Rivers): Mr. Speaker, I desire to rise to a question of privilege. Upon referring to Hansard this morning I notice that the hon. member for East Edmonton (Mr. Mackie) in his remarks attributes to me a statement which I did not make and therefore I desire to correct him. As I made my remarks in French it will not probably be possible for all the members to read what I said until the translation is made. The hon. member for East Edmonton said:

If I do rise to speak at all, Mr. Chairman, it is that I in the main agree with that hon. gentleman. I do not agree, however, that you should not increase the military force in Canada because there were military individuals in the city of Winnipeg who incited, by their presence, the civil population to acts such as have characterized the conditions of things that exists in that city at the present time.

I desire to say that I did not say anything of the kind and that my remarks do not contain anything to justify that statement which is absolutely erroneous.
