Mr. GREEN: Will that show how many have been discharged after enlistment in the air force or the navy?

Mr. MACKENZIE (Vancouver Centre): In the air force, yes.

Mr. MARSHALL: I think a great problem which confronts this government at the present

time is the rehabilitation of those men, discharged from the army, who have not yet been absorbed into employment. This problem was engaging the attention of the government as far back as November of last year. According to order in council P.C. 4068½, dated December 8, 1939, there was constituted a special committee of the cabinet whose object was to
