I might say that there are many doctors from Welland. I should also like to point out that when I suggested it was going to get worse, I meant that—

Some hon. Members: Order!

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Penner): Order, please. It is not proper for the hon. member to enter the debate at this point. The hon. member for Cape Breton-The Sydneys (Mr. Muir) has the floor.

Mr. Muir: Mr. Speaker, I apologize to the hon. member. He is a member of an honourable profession and I did not think I was slurring or hurting him when I referred to him as "doctor". In any event, I will certainly not refer to him as the charming lady from Welland.

Some hon. Members: Oh, oh!

Mr. Muir: Mr. Speaker, may I call it six o'clock?

Mr. Baker (Grenville-Carleton): Mr. Speaker, I wonder if there is someone on the other side of the House who knows the intentions of the government regarding the business for tomorrow and can inform the House.

Mr. Caccia: Mr. Speaker, it is my understanding that we will continue with this bill.
