- 14. When the "previous question" is moved and seconded, it shall be put in this form, "Shall the main question be now put?" If this be carried, all further motions, amendments and debate shall be excluded, and the question shall be put without delay.
- 15. The President shall state every question properly presented to the Society, and before putting it to vote shall ask, "Are you ready for the question?" Should no member offer to speak, he shall rise to put the motion; and after he has risen, no member shall be permitted to speak upon it.
- 16. Upon the request of any five members the Yeas and Nays on any question shall be recorded on the minutes.
- 17. Any member offering a protest against any of the proceedings of this Society, may have the same, if in respectful language, entered in full upon the minutes.
- 18. It shall be in order to move a reconsideration of any question within two week asfter its decision. A motion for a second reconsideration of the same question shall not be in order at any time.
- 19. A motion to reconsider the decision of the Society on any question, must be made by a member who voted in favor of such decision, and shall be put without discussion.
- 20. A motion to adjourn simply, shall always be in order, except: 1st, when a member is in possession of the floor; 2nd, when members are voting; 3rd, when an adjournment was the last preceding motion; or, 4th, when it has been decided that the previous question shall be put.
- 21. A motion to adjourn simply, cannot be amended, but, a motion to adjourn to a given time may be amended and debated.
- 22. Two weeks' notice in writing shall be given of motions for the appointment of committees, the suspension, expulsion, re-election, or censuring of a member, the reconsideration, or discussion of any question, or resolution, to amend the laws and rules of order, or for a return from an officer or
