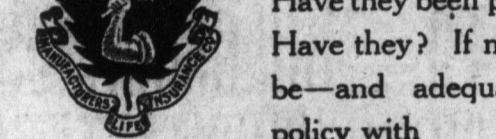

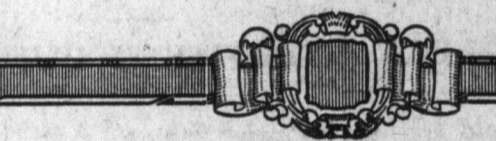

NO FURTHER U. S. ACTION AGAINST DR. DUMBA

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—High officials indicated tonight that no further steps were contemplated against Dr. Constantin Theodor Dumba, the Austro-Hungarian ambassador, on account of his letter to Secretary of State Lansing, criticizing the treatment accorded him by the American Government in connection with the release of his recall. It was stated that the possibility of hastening the diplomatic departure from the country by handing him his passports had not been considered.
