

11. Exhibitors to give the necessary personal attention to whatever they may have on exhibition. No articles lost will be paid for, but all due diligence will be used to protect goods.

12. Two tickets of admission will be given to each member. Members will be required to pay for admission to the Exhibition held in the evenings.

13. No person shall enter for exhibition more than one exhibit in any one section of a class, unless the additional article be a distinct named variety or pattern from the first. This rule not to apply to animals, but to all kinds of grain, vegetable products, fruits, manufactured articles, etc., in which each additional exhibit would necessarily be precisely similar to the first. No exhibitor in the arts and manufacturers' department will be awarded more than one prize in any one section of the same class.

14. Intending exhibitors will save themselves a great deal of trouble and the Secretary a vast amount of annoyance by making their entries the week previous to the exhibition. Entries may be made by mail. See that every article entered is made under some one of headings in regular list. Any member found violating any of these rules will forfeit any prizes which they may have taken and be subject to expulsion from the society.

15 Any exhibitor lodging a protest, must make it **IN WRITING** and it must be delivered to the President or Secretary **WITHIN TWO DAYS AFTER THE CLOSE OF THE FAIR**; it must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$3, which sum shall be forfeited to the Association if the said protest is not sustained. This rule not to apply to trials of speed, the rules regulating which shall be governed by the National Association. The Board of Directors, however, earnestly hope that the exhibitors will not enter protests without the strongest grounds for so doing, as much annoyance and unpleasantness is often occasioned by protests of a frivolous nature. All prizes not claimed **within two months** after the Fair will be forfeited for the use of the Society.

ADMISSION TO GROUNDS.

The admission for adults will be 25 cents each time of entering. Children under 12 years of age, 10 cents. Carriages, single, 25 cents; double, 50 cents.

Necessary attendants upon stock and machinery will be furnished with special passes on applying at the Secretary's office on the grounds. These passes will bear the names of the persons to whom they are issued, and if presented by any other person will be forfeited. They will only admit the holder twice each day, and not more than three tickets to any one person, and not more than two to any one collection of sewing machines.

Members will be entitled to two tickets only.

The entry tickets upon the animals or articles, will admit the person bringing them to the show ground for exhibition along with such animal or article. Afterward such parties must be provided with the proper passes as above or they will have to pay the regular admission fee.

Persons bringing stock or other articles to the ground on a wagon or with teams, must in all cases, as soon as unloaded, remove such wagon or teams from the grounds.

in the exhibition building must be made the week previous.
