

by sickness, lameness, blindness, age or infirmity whatsoever, he shall be entitled to, and receive from the fund of the Society, Twenty Shillings weekly, during the first twelve weeks of his inability aforesaid, and Ten Shillings weekly during the remainder of such inability.

Funeral expences and relief to Widows & Children.

ART. 5. On the death of every Member, having contributed as aforesaid, and while the income shall exceed the expenditure, there shall be paid out of the Funds, to the person intitled to receive the same, Ten Pounds for the expence of his Funeral, and Fifty Pounds for the use of his Widow and Children, or such other of his family as may have depended solely upon him for subsistence. Ten Pounds, shall, in like manner, be paid to every Member, having contributed as aforesaid, on the death of his Wife, to defray the expences of her Funeral.

Who may become Members.

ART. 6. Every person in sound health, between twenty one and forty five years of age, residing within the Province of Lower Canada, may become a Member, on being balloted
