ness, reflect often on the engagements which you have contracted at a communion table—habitually anticipate that period, when he who "was once "offered to bear the sins of many, shall appear the "second time, without sin unto salvation"—and fervently pray for the aids of that divine Spirit, who is promised to them that ask him, and who will make you "meet to be partakers of the inheritance of "the saints in light." Now "the God of peace, that "brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that "great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of "the everlasting covenant, make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which "is well-pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; "to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen."
