Military Forces Also Occupy **Municipal Buildings** of Dublin.

PARLEYS CONTINUE

Only Hitch in Peace Discussions-Will Be Resumed

DUBLIN, Dec. 22 .- Military forces today occupied the city hall and mutoday occupied the city hall and municipal buildings in accordance with the demand on Monday of General Boyd, commander of the Dublin district, who sent a notice to the Dublin corporation requesting possession of the buildings by today. A large portion of the public services will be disorganized, as no other office has been secured. Sentries were posted and the erection of defences carried out early this morning. When the city officials arrived only the town clerk, his assistant and two employees in his department were allowed to enter.

WAS ONLY HITCH.

DUBLIN, Dec. 22.—There is no truth in the rumors that peace negotiations have been broken off, the Associated Press is authoritatively informed. There has been only a hitch in the peace discussions, and the belief is expressed that the negotiations will soon be resumed, with good prospects of success.

LONDON, Dec. 22.—The Central News, in a dispatch from Dublin, says that should Eamonn de Valera, "president of the Irish Republic," arrive in Ireland, no attempt will be made to arrest him. This statement is attributed to officials in Dublin.

The dispatch adds that conversations regarding possible peace in Ireland continue, and that new developments in the situation are expected.

## **BILL PASSES IN** U. S. CONGRESS

Protests of Defiant Minority of No Avail.

Dublin, Dec. 22.—Passage of the Irish home rule bill by the British Parliament is not viewed as specially important by newspapers here. It is recognized the bill probably will not be accepted by either Ulster or the rest of Ireland and that the British Government may never decide to put its provisions into operation.

"Carsonism has received its reward." says the Freeman's Journal. "The bill was designed as a trap, but it falled to work. Even such modified democratic institutions as we possess are threatened by it."

The Irish Independent says there will be no rejoicings in Ireland over passage of the measure "which makes a settlement still more difficult."

"Thanks to the House of Lords," says the Irish Times, "the bill has ceased to be a measure to bring about absolute and permanent partition of Ireland, and fine central council which is established may become a real link between the north and south."

WOULDN'T TRY

that a serious deadlock is arising between the Federal Government and the that a serious deadlock is arising between the Federal Government and the prairie provinces in respect to the settlement—of the natural resources question, owing to the unwillingness of the federal authorities to consider the problem from a strictly constitutional viewpoint, is contained in a preliminary report on the recent Ottawa conference by Premier T. C. Norris after a consultation with Hon. T. H. Johnson, attorney-general, and considered at the council meeting last night.

Manitoba based its demand for a settlement of the long-delayed question on constitutional grounds. Hon. Arthur Meighen in reply tentatively suggested that the prairie provinces take over the natural resources remaining without an accounting being made of the lands and resources alienated during the period of Dominion control. The report clearly indicates this is ungatisfactory. A conference of all western statesmen will be held here before the new year, and an ultimatum forwarded.
