

Curling Protest Is Not Allowed

Note and Comment

No, President Goldie did not emphasize any technicality in arriving at his decision, but very opportunely referred to the following rule, which is No. 31 of the rules of curling:

While the main object of matches between clubs is to determine their relative skill in the game, it should ever be borne in mind that the ultimate object is to develop a manly recreation, and to promote good-will, kindly feeling and honorable conduct among those who take part in it, and that the interpretation and the application of the rules should be in accordance with these objects.

Thus the president landed the curlers firmly back on the mark, and everyone except Lakeview made a mistake, even the umpire, and the umpire's report by verbal evidence. He was aided in no other way by members of the Ontario Curling Association committee, and decided as follows:
