MONTREAL PRODUCE MARKET.

Montreal, Sept. 13.—The local trade in cash grain is quiet today. There were no further developments in the flour situation. The mill feed market was without feature. There is no change in the condition of the baled hay market. The egg market is fairly active. The condition of the potato market is steady. The butter market was quiet.

CATTLE PRICES MAKE
VERY SHARP DECLINE

Heavy Receipts and Increase in Freight Rates Are Factors.

With 5,000 cattle on sale at the Union Yards yesterday, the market was generally all the way from 15c to 16c per cwt. lower. The general quality of the cattle was fair to medium, and what few good and choice butchers cattle were there sold more quickly than the others, but at a much lower level than a week ago.

There were no very choice steers on sale, and outstanding prices were made, and quite a number of cattle were sold for feeding purposes. The cow trade was fairly steady for good cows, but slow and dragging on the medium and common classes.

The bull trade was generally very bad. Choice bulls sold at from \$10 to \$12; medium bulls, \$7.50 to \$9; common, \$5 to \$7, and bologna bulls, \$3 to \$5.

For much cows and springers there was a fair demand for the better class. The cause of the heavy supply and big decline was probably due in large measure to the increased freight rates and a desire to clear the yards.

The sharp decline was the heavy consignments of western cattle sent in direct to some of the big plants. In any event, it was a pretty bad market, as many of the drovers know to their sorrow.
