BANKER BIGELOW IS NOW BANKRUPT. Defaulting Milwaukee Bank President Owes Almost \$3,000—His Lack of System Staggers Faith in Bankers—Ranks With Mrs. Chadwick.

MILWAUKEE, April 27.—Frank G. Bigelow, the defaulting bank president, has confessed an indebtedness to banks, commercial institutions and estates of which he had charge which will aggregate between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000, and based on his confession, a voluntary petition in bankruptcy has been filed in the United States district court, which cites the names of as many of Mr. Bigelow's creditors as he can remember, together with a list of assets on which Mr. Bigelow's valuation is \$1,419,000.
