CANADIANS HAVE WON CLOSER TO PASSCHENDAELE

Outposts Even Venture Into Village Itself

NEWS GLEANED FROM PRISONERS

They Tell of Increasing Unrest in Ge-many-Enemy Loses Heavy in Fighting with Dominion Troops—Bavarian Morale Weakening

Canadian Headquarters in France, Nov. 2.—(By W. A. Willis, Special Correspondent of the Canadian Press.)—The Canadians have closed in further toward Passchendaele. Following the great battle on the left wing, when our troops on the extreme left proved their marked superiority over the enemy while the chivalrously ventured into Passchendaele itself, the fighting has been intermittent all along the line.

Opposite Metercle, where the front lines are near together, the Canadians and the Bosches, under the Red Cross flag, buried their dead and evacuated their wounded on Wednesday afternoon and repaid one another in the mud and slime.

Information gathered from prisoners indicates increasing unrest in Germany. Bread riots are reported in Hamburg so far back as last April, when the disturbances were of such a nature that the soldiers in the training camps there called out any moment. According to one prisoner, there is much dissatisfaction in Germany, and in the trains and semi-public places discussions and comparisons of the political situation with the recent revolt in Russia are frequent.

Another prisoner confirmed this, but did not believe the unrest would go so far as a revolution, as the disciplinary measures are so strict.

Much confusion in the enemy's plan of resistance against our attacks, together with proof of his heavy losses, was the information afforded by the examination of other prisoners. Our machine gun barrage was so effective on October 30 that reinforcements were entirely cut off from the enemy. In some instances—for example, the 22nd Bavarian Infantry reserve, in which both the front and rear companies sustained very heavy casualties—the men in front, seeing that they could not expect any reinforcements, surrendered.

The morale of the Bavarians is weakening fast, having been greatly reduced in the last few days of the conflict with the Canadians. Men are reported to have cleared out of the front line and gone into a siding before the attack, while one company in the sector deserted entirely.

ANOTHER POST FOR MICHAELS
Von Hertling Said to Have Succeeded in Making Arrangements With All But Socialists and Conservatives

Copenhagen, Nov. 2.—That Count George Von Hertling has been appointed Imperial German chancellor is announced in an official statement received. It is understood that Michaelis will take over another high imperial office for which his qualifications are admitted generally.

Berlin correspondents report that Von Hertling has succeeded in establishing satisfactory working arrangements with all parties except the Socialists and the Conservatives. Even the Socialists, it is added, although not abandoning their attitude of reserve, can be counted upon to make no difficulties for the new government unless unforeseen conditions develop.

This virtually amounts to the revocation of the existing Reichstag bloc with the active support of the national Liberals. In the Reichstag the Conservatives alone maintain an adverse attitude toward the incoming chancellor.

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SYMPATHY FOR RUSSIA; NOT SUSPICION

One Who Knows Writes O Kerensky Statement

LONDON TIMES' PETROGRAD MAN

Russia's Share in War Under Estimated—"What She Had She Has Given"—Views on Criticism of British Fleet

London, Nov. 2.—Most of the morning newspapers print Premier Kerensky's interview conspicuously, but the comment is not general. The Petrograd correspondent of the Daily Telegraph, who is now in London, writes:

"Premier Kerensky's statement seems to have been taken a little too seriously in some quarters. It has been construed as a hint that Russia is trying with the idea of a separate peace. This theory should not be allowed to establish itself.

"Probably all Kerensky wished was to indicate the facts familiar to close students of Russia for some time, and they are such as to arouse sympathy rather than suspicion. It is true that Russia is worn out and it has been true for a much longer time than had elapsed since the outbreak of the revolution. Unfortunately, until that event military exigencies prevented the truth from being told about Russia's share in the war, which has been greatly under estimated. The essential fact is that what Russia had given."

The writer then tells of the immense sacrifices in men that Russia has made and recalls the revelations in the trial of General Soukhomlinoff (former minister of war, of how Russian heroes stood up with only sticks, stones and fists against the organized German troops. He believes that the Russian casualties have been higher than those of any other of the main belligerents.

The writer also emphasizes the privations of the civilian population and shortage of food since the middle of 1917.

The Daily Express makes a similar plea, and says that no statesman ever faced more appalling difficulties than those that daily confront Premier Kerensky. It admits that Russia bore the burden of the first months of the war and that the Russian people have made the greatest sacrifices for the British fleet.

The British Fleet.
London, Nov. 2.—General Gurko of the Russian army, who recently visited England from Russia, in an interview with the Daily Express, says that Premier Kerensky's statement was a masterpiece of the first months of the war and that the Russian people have made the greatest sacrifices for the British fleet.

He declared that such a statement was not only impossible but that it could not have been carried out in time to prevent the Germans from landing on the islands in the Gulf.

General Gurko considers it true to a considerable extent that Russia bore the brunt of the fighting in the first eight months of the war, but it was realized that if the allied cause was not to be ruined this was necessary. He agrees completely with Kerensky's statement, and he is exhausted for the time being, but adds that Russia should be able to undertake her share of the fighting.

U. S. TIGHTENS GRIP ON FLOUR INDUSTRY

New York, Nov. 2.—The milling division of the United States food administration announced last night that effective immediately, that all direct trade to American millers, exporters and blenders of flour with European countries is prohibited. This business will be handled hereafter only by the food administration.

The new regulations were made, it was said, "to effect proper control and to centralize the handling of exports of flour to European nations," and in order "to protect the interest of consumers who have necessarily had to pay a relatively high price for flour purchased in very small packages."

It also was announced that, effective on December 1, all flour millers operating under agreement with the federal food administration "will not be permitted to sell flour in packages of other than one eighth, one-quarter, and one half barrel or larger, and from January 1, 1918, no miller will be permitted to ship flour in packages other than these described."
