BRUCE RENEWS CHARGES Says Marwitz Evades the Issue as to Atrocities in Belgium

London, Sept. 30.—Speaking of comments by General von Marwitz on Bryce commission's report on German treatment of Belgian non-combatants, Lord Bryce said:
