## HICCOUGH WAVE BAFFLES DOCTORS

More Than a Dozen Cases in  
the London Hospitals.

London, Feb. 17.—Europe's newest malady, the "hiccough" epidemic, has completely baffled British physicians. After sporadic outbreaks on the continent it has at last reached England, and there are more than a dozen cases in London hospitals. One death is recorded. Several other sufferers are in a serious condition.

The complaint has been most prevalent in Paris, where, in one instance, it lasted six days, the temperature of the patient rising to 102 degrees. French expert opinion considers the malady as a neuropsychic, a view which is accepted with reserve in England.

"The origin of the disease, if it can be called that, is a complete mystery," explained a leading hospital physician. "I have been a sufferer myself, my experience being distinctly unpleasant. It was impossible to eat and drink as usual, and I suffered greatly from the racking effort. We do not know anything about it, and the medical world views the situation, if it spreads, with considerable alarm."

## REFUSED 75 CTS. HOUR NOW BEG FOR RELIEF

Ship Builders in Toronto Now  
Seek Charity.

Toronto, Feb. 17.—Several shipbuilders who have been on strike here for some time applied to the civic relief quarters on Saturday for relief, but were refused. The officials handling the relief for the city claimed that they had a right to assume that the strikers, being union men, were drawing strike pay from the union. They also took the ground that these men had been offered work and had refused it, whereas the civic relief was for men who could not obtain employment. The shipbuilders went on strike because the Collingwood Shipbuilding Co. would not pay more than 75 cents an hour, although the men demanded 90 cents an hour, their rate of pay with the Dominion Shipbuilding Co. before that firm failed. The Collingwood Co. is finishing two ships for the Federal Government that were begun by the Dominion Shipbuilding Co.

## IMPROVEMENTS AT EPIDEMIC ARE RECOMMENDED

Extensive alteration and improvement in the arrangement and direction of the epidemic hospital were authorized at the meeting of the board of commissioners last night. Matters regarding the routine of meetings were also dealt with and the question of arranging a suite in the nurses' home for the epidemic was decided, will be brought before the municipal council. J. King Kelley was in the chair. Other members present were: Mrs. J. V. McMillan, Frank Flewelling, William Emerson, Dr. R. J. G. Crawford, Alexander MacMillan, Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts, J. L. O'Brien and Dr. H. Hedden, superintendent of the hospital.

Four previous notices of motion were dealt with. Mr. Kelley's motion that the hour of meeting be changed to 8 p.m. carried. Mr. Kelley's next motion was that the training school board thereafter consist of the membership of the commission. The board previously consisted of Commissioners McMillan, McMillan, Crawford, Emerson and the visiting commissioner.

After some discussion the motion carried. Mr. Emerson thought that members might give publicity to matters concerning the interest of the hospital, and Dr. Crawford said he was glad to have the opportunity to give the public his views on hospitals which he was the only one opposed to the present scheme. The matter of providing a suite for the epidemic in the new nurses' home was brought up by Mrs. McMillan. Mr. Kelley explained the dietitian had expected to have a suite in the new nurses' home and that if a mistake had been made the mistake should be remedied and provision in the building for the suite should be made at once.

Dr. Crawford paid a high tribute to the matron, Miss Mitchell, and said that all three heads of the departments should have the same accommodation in the home.

Mr. Kelley said that since it involved an expenditure of \$700 to make a suite for the dietitian the matter should be referred to the municipal council before action was taken.

Dr. Roberts suggested that since finances were so serious a condition it might be possible to have two nurses share a bedroom. The plans of the nurses' home were shown and Mr. Emerson pointed out where a suite could be arranged at a less expense than \$700. On motion, Dr. Hedden and Mr. Emerson were requested to do so and went out to make actual examination of the building. turn and take up her duties at the hospital.


Mr. Emerson reported on his personal

Dr. Roberts' Statement.

The recommendations of Dr. Roberts'  
report as commissioner of the month,  
previously read, were dealt with. The  
arrangement of the basement of the ep-  
idemic as a flat for a janitor and his wife  
and the setting apart of special rooms  
there for washing machine and mangle  
for clothes and for special services, the  
first recommendation carried.

The employment of a janitor and his  
wife and the giving of a new office to  
the present janitor was the next resolu-  
tion and it carried.

The next recommendation stated more  
nurses, probably a total of six nurses,  
were required in the epidemic hospital.  
Dr. Roberts thought more space should  
be made to accommodate the nurses at  
the expense of the accommodation for  
the patients. This was referred to the  
commissioner of the month and Dr.  
Roberts.

The appointment of a permanent car-  
penter and a permanent plumber as  
recommended by the engineer also was  
opposed by Mr. Emerson, although he  
spoke in commendation of the ability of  
the engineer. Mr. Emerson said only  
emergency work would call for an extra  
man. On Dr. Roberts' motion this re-  
solution was laid over till the engineer could  
be present at the next meeting.
