Germany May Resist

Passage of Allied Army
(Continued from page 1.)

Warsaw, Aug. 6—Russian gains are conceded north and east of Warsaw; where the Soviet forces are re-grouping for what may be the final exertion in their attempt to bring Poland to their terms of peace.

In the centre front, bearing down upon Warsaw from the northeast, the Russians, according to the communication, are being held along the Ostrow-Czerwony line to the Bug.

London, Aug. 6—A semi-official message wrom Warsaw, filed last night, says the Poles have evacuated Ostrov, between the Bug and Narew rivers, twenty-five miles southwest of Lomza and about fifty-five miles northeast of Warsaw.
