### WAGONLOAD OF COIN TO BUY BEEF STEW

One Dollar Is Worth 240  
Rubles—Russian Money  
Greatly Depreciated.

If the housewife in Siberia should hap-  
pen to have a few silver dollars in her  
possession on a shopping tour and should  
attempt to spend them for food the  
chances are she would return to her  
home with a basket full of Russian  
rubles and her marbling in her pocket.  
—that is if the wearing apparel of wo-  
men in that part of the far east has  
pockets. At any rate, she would have a  
whole lot more money in quantity than  
she had when she began the shopping  
tour, according to a letter received in  
Seattle from E. L. Matteson, agent for  
the Pacific Steamship Company in Vi-  
ladivostok.

Mr. Matteson says a silver dollar is  
worth 240 rubles in Siberia, and it was  
not uncommon for him to purchase some  
article worth 40 rubles and receive 200  
rubles in change for one of Uncle Sam's  
coins.

And if you make purchases in Siberia  
with either gold or silver you must re-  
ceive your change in rubles, according to  
Mr. Matteson. The new Russian govern-  
ment is determined to keep the Ameri-  
can gold and silver in the country, if it  
can, and has issued an edict to the  
effect that change must be made in  
rubles. It has also decreed that ship-  
pers must put up the full value of the  
goods they purchase in gold and force  
them to sell only for rubles.

Mr. Matteson said he had just com-  
pleted a trip from Vladivostok to Har-  
bin and was forced to take bedding and  
food along for the entire round trip.  
"Food is so high in the interior that it  
takes a wagon load of rubles to buy a  
beef stew," said Mr. Matteson. "I was  
in Harbin on March 1 and found the  
hotels crowded and the thermometer 25  
degrees below zero. There is a terrible  
mix-up in money. Everybody seems to  
have a different kind of coin, and it  
keeps you guessing. The old Russian  
government's rule is about the only  
one that will buy anything and I found  
that if there is a hole in the coin as
