Try This Recipe:
SNOWDRIFT FRENCH ROLLS

1 pint milk
2 eggs
1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons butter
1 yeast cake
2 teaspoons sugar
3 pints Snowdrift

Add to the well-beaten eggs and salt the milk, lukewarm. Rub the butter into the flour; mix until the yeast liquifies, then pour into the milk and eggs and add all these to the flour. Knead to a dough, let it rise three hours, keep in a warm room free from draughts. Form into rolls and let rise again about half an hour. The length of time will depend somewhat on the temperature of the room. Bake in a quick oven, brushing over with butter before baking to brown them more.

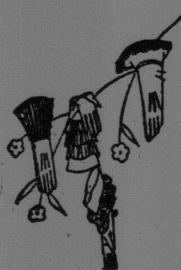
