

5. That a Minister in each District be appointed annually, by Conference as General Missionary Committee Delegate, who shall visit any of the Missions in his District; and also Circuits when required, to advise and assist under the direction of the Missionary and General Committees.

6. That the Consolidated rules presented by the Consolidating Committee, through the General Committee, be adopted, as amended, and that they be printed and published in connection with the Minutes of Conference.

19.—What Changes are now made in Relation to Church property.

1. That the Trustees of Clairville, Etobicoke Circuit have permission to sell their Church Lot, the proceeds to be applied in securing a better Church.

2. That the application of the authorities of Scarboro Circuit, to sell Bethel Church building be granted.

3. That the authorities of Rosemont Station have permission to reconvey to Mr. W. Tram, the Old Church Site at Thompsonville, a more valuable Site having been obtained from Mr. Tram.

4. That the Conference hereby empowers the Trustees of the Church, on Market Street, in the City of Brantford; to sell the Church and premises, and to apply the proceeds to the building of a new Church, and Bros. Bee, J. Milner, and J. C. Antliff, be a Committee to proceed to Brantford and make preliminary arrangements for the sale of the Old Church, and the purchase of a Lot for the erection of a new one.

5. That the Trustees of Bervie Church, Kincardine Station, have power to sell their Church property, and that the proceeds be forwarded to the Mission Office, and all claims against the Church be also forwarded to the office for payment, and that when all just claims have been met, the balance be applied in building a Church at Ripley, if they build, and if not it shall go to the Jubilee Fund.

20.—What letters of sympathy were sent by the Conference?

That letters of sympathy be written to Bros. Edgar, Antliff, Hughan, Griffith, Boyle, and Adams, offering the affectionate sympathy of the Conference, in the losses they have sustained, or afflictions through which they have passed, or are now passing,
