THE SNOW BLOCKADE.

SACRAMENTO AND TRUCKEE COMMUNICATED FOR A SHORT TIME.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Jan. 27.—Railroad officials at Sacramento succeeded in having communication for a short time last night with Truckee, on the Eastern slope of the Sierra mountains and it was learned that the snow was 16 feet deep on the track, between that place and the station five miles west of there.

From Colusa, in the western part of the Sacramento valley, reports come that for 22 miles north and south of there the farms are covered with water to a depth of 2 to 3 feet. The loss throughout the state by flood cannot be even approximately estimated at this time.
