In order, however, that we may not withdraw our fellow without sufficient reason from any Church or Minister against whom a complain made by two members of this body, it shall be the duty of the Association to appear a Committee to investigate the points of complaint, and report the result of their quiries to the Association, that they may decide as duty shall appear.
