Anti-Alien Land Bill Passed.

Sacramento, Cal., May 3.—The administration anti-alien landholding bill, drawn by Attorney General Webb, passed the Senate early this morning by a vote of 35 to 2, after nearly tenhours of debate. The only negative votes were cast by Senators Cartwright, Democrat, and Wright, Republican. The fullility of Secretary Bryan's mission was shown in the vote of his own party. Nine of the ten Democrats voted contrary to the advice which he brought from President Wilson, while not a single Progressive yielded to his expressed wishes.
