**CURRY RECIPES** 

Mulligatawny Soup

Mulligatawny Soup

Pour two quarts of cold water over
two pounds of neck of mutton
(seems); do not boil, only simmer. In
another exacepan melt one dessertspoonful of butter or dripping; into it
slice two apples (pecied and cored),
two carloss, two white turnips, two
lecks and a bunch of sweet herbs. Fry
them all for a few minutes, then pour
on one pint of the mutton liquor. Bon
for half an hour; then mix two tablespoonfuls of flour, one tablespoonful
of salt to a cream with a little cold
water. Str into the the soup, adding
the meat and remainder of the tispoor.
Simmer for three hours. Take the
meat out, strain through a sieve and
serve with belied rice and cut lemon.
Curted Fish

Heat two ounces of fat or butter in
a saucespan, and in it fry two onlons,
one apple, or a stick of rinbarb out
up into small pieces. Sir in one
tablespoonful of curry-powder, and a little
salt and pepper, and gradually stir
in one pint of water or fish liquor.
Bring to the boil and simmer gently
for half an hour. Just before straining, stir in one teaspoonful of lemonjuice or vinegar, strain, return to the
saucepan with one pound of the cut
into neat pieces. Allow the soup to
get thoroughly hot. If the fish is
cooked purposely to curry, boil it in
one pint of water to make the stock
for the curry. Serve the curry in a
border of boiled rice.

Boil the eggs twenty minutes. Prepare your curry whilst the eggs are

Let them remain about tea minutes, and serve in a rice border.
