New York, March 21—Years ago it was an uncommon occurrence for an epidemic of diphtheria, scarlet fever or some other malignant disease to sweep through the public schools, depopulating class rooms, terrorizing parents and claiming hundreds of youthful lives. Such visitations now are but memories.

As late as 1903 65,000 children were excluded from the public schools of New York city because they suffered from the ban. Number examined In 1903 65 294 children were excluded by the inspectors on account of contagious disenses. The following year this number was reduced to 25,369, while last year only 18,844 were kept out of school.
