TELEGRAM 169

Ottawa, November 29, 1941

SECRET. With reference to my despatch of October 28, 1940,<sup>1</sup> and other correspondence relating to steps to be taken in the event of War between Canada and Japan.

Will you please confirm that all essential preparations have been made covering the following points:

- A. Placing of Canadian interests in the hands of the protecting power.
- B. Drafting of necessary communication to the Japanese Government including points mentioned in paragraph 2 of your despatch of December 6, 1940, No. 254.<sup>2</sup>
- C. Compiling of complete inventory covering all Canadian Government properties.
- D. Arranging for disposition of all Canadian Government properties including destruction of cyphers and secret documents.
- E. Arranging for exit of Canadian officials.
- F. Other required procedures.

Please reply as quickly as possible.
