### Civil Suit against a Brantford Alderman.

On behalf of George Tomlin G. Bowditch K.C., Brantford has started suit in the Supreme Court of Ontario against Ald. J. Harvey. Clement for the sum of \$1,000. This is carrying out his threat when the criminal action against Clement recently failed, the Magistrate claiming that the charge should never have been brought to court and ordering the defendant to be honorably acquitted. The defendant was a member of a military exemption tribunal and Tomlin claimed that he had paid him \$700 to maintain his exemption. The charge was categorically denied by Ald. Clement.

### A Gas Case at Hamilton.

Chief Justice Sir William Mulock yesterday afternoon opened the summer sittings of the Supreme Court at Hamilton. The first case called was that of the Dominion Natural Gas Company to annul a contract with the United Gas & Fuel Company. The defendant has entered a counterclaim for alleged breach of contract claiming that gas was diverted from Hamilton to Simcoe when there was a shortage. The defendants were not ready to proceed, and the case was laid over until the next session.

### Dr. Nichol Dead.

Dr. William Nichol one of the oldest and best known of Brantford's physicians, died there yesterday afternoon after a long illness. He was taken down with influenza last October. He was one of the originators of the Y.M.C.A. movement in Canada was prominent in the Liberal party as a supporter of the late Hon. William Patterson and a leading member of Zion Presbyterian Church. He was in his 82nd year and is survived by his wife, two sons, Dr. Nichol Brantford, and Charles Clan Brantford, Ont., and two daughters, Ethel and Mabel at home.

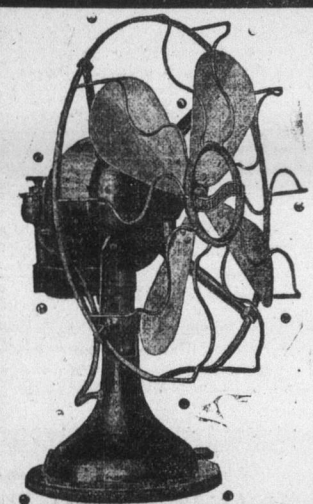
