Reges, Principes, & Status, Articulis fequentibus indigitari, ut & alii, qui ante Ratihabitionum permutationem, vel intra fex menses postea ab una alteraque Parte, ex communi consensu nominabuntur, sibi persuasum habentibus altememoratis Regiis Majestatibus eos dispositiones per hunc Tractatum factas & stabilitas agnituros, in eodem pro Amicitiæ reciprocæ Testimonio, includentur, & comprehendentur.

Quidquid in Compositione Pacis, inter Sacram Regiam Majestatem Hispania, & Sacram Regiam Majestatem Lustrania, proximè ineunda, contentum suerit, pravià Sacra Regia Majestatis Magna Britannia Approbatione, hujus Tractatûs pats essentialis esse censebitur, perindè atque hic transcriptum esser ad verbum. S. insuper Regia Majestas Magna Britannia sese offert Sponsorem, sive Guarantem fore pradicta Pacis Compositionis, quod illa reâpse, conceptisque verbis prastate spondet, eum in sinem ut inviolatius, sanctiusque servetur.

XXI.

Trastatus Pacis hodie initus inter S. Regiam Majestatem Catholicam, & Regiam suam Celstrudinem Sabaudia Ducem, in hoc Trastatu speciali er, tanquam pars ejus essentialis, inclusus est &

and on the other, shall be granted to the said Subjects of each of their said Royal Majesties, in order to their selling the aforesaid things, or any other their Essects, or carrying away and transporting the same from thence, whithersoever they please, without any Molestation.

XIX.

The Kings, Princes, and States, mentioned in the following Articles, and all others who shall be nominated on either side, by common Consent, before the Ratifications are exchanged, or within Six Months after, shall, for a Mark of mutual Friendship, be included and comprehended in th's Treaty, their Royal Majesties aforenamed being persuaded that they will approve all the Settlements made and established by it.

XX.

Whatsoever shall be contained in the Treaty of Peace next entred into between his Sacred Royal Majesty of Spain, and his Sacred Royal Majesty of Portugal, with the previous Approbation of Her Royal Majesty of Great Britain. shall be deemed an effential Part of this Treaty, in the same manner as if it was transcribed here word for word. Moreover Her Sacred Royal Majesty of Great Britain offers Her self to be a Surety or Guarantee of the aforesaid Agreement of Peace, which she promises to fulfil according to the Substance and Words thereof, I to the end that it may be observed the more Sacred and Inviolable.

XXI.

The Treaty of Peace this Day entred into between his Royal Catholick Majesty and his Royal Highness the Duke of Sxvoy, is specially included in and confirmed by this Treaty, as an essential
