

SCOTT, Lt.-Col. THOMAS. (*Winnipeg.*)

Parents emigrated to Can. from Armagh, Irel., in 1836. B. in the County of Lanark, Ont., 1841. Ed. at Perth High School. M. in 1863, at Perth, second dau. of Robt. Kellock, Esq. Commenced the publication of the *Perth Expositor* newspaper, in the Conservative interest, in the year 1861, and conducted it until 1873, when he removed to Manitoba. Was capt. of a volunteer corps at Perth, and was on frontier duty at Brockville and Prescott for three months, in 1866; gazetted Major of the 42nd Batt., same year, and Bt. Lt.-Col. in '71; received command of a company in the Ontario Rifles in '70, forming part of the Red River Expeditionary Force, under Col. Wolsley; returned to Ontario, winter of '70-'71, and when the Fenians invaded Manitoba in the fall of '71, again offered his services to the Govt., and was appointed to the command of the second expedition, which, after undergoing severe hardships, arrived safely at Fort Garry on 18 Nov. '71. Elected Mayor of the City of Winnipeg in '77 by a majority of votes, and in '78 by acclamation. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1878; re-elected at last g.e. Conservative.—*Winnipeg, Man.*

SMITH, JOHN. (*Burnside.*)

A native of England. B. 29 Jan. 1817. Has resided in Canada 37 years. Settled in Co. Wellington, Ont., and remained there until 1873, when he came to Manitoba. Has been Reeve of the township of Pilkington and Warden of the Co. Wellington. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A supporter of the present Govt.—*Oakland, Burnside, Man.*

SUTHERLAND, ALEXANDER MACBETH (*Kildonan*)

Third s. of Hon. John Sutherland, Senator, by Jeannette Macbeth, second dau. of the late John Macbeth, Esq., one of the early Selkirk colonists, who came to this country from Scotland in 1813. B. 31 Dec. 1849 at Point Douglass, now the city of Winnipeg. Ed. at Kildonan Public School, St. John's College, Manitoba College and Toronto University, where he graduated as Bachelor of Arts in June 1876, and entered as student-at-law at Osgoode Hall, Toronto, in August of the same year. First returned at g.e. 1878; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Winnipeg, Man.*
