BILL

An Act to make better provision for regulating the measurement of Coal, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

WHEREAS the laws now in force which regulate the measurement Preamble. of coal are frequently productive of great trouble and difficulty, I give rise to many abuses and frauds, more especially with respect lo measurement for the purpose of estimating cargoes and calculating he freight thereupon, and it is therefore expedient to make new provisions for such measurement, and to make further provisions for the enefit of owners of vessels engaged in the carriage of coal and other reight on certain waters of Lower Canada; Therefore Her Majesty, kc., enacts as follows :

I. So much of the Act of Lower Canada 6 Wm. IV, Cap. 36, regu-Part of 6 W. 4 ating the measurement of coal as defines the exact contents of a chal- c. 86. L. C. repealed. non thereof, and regulates the dimension of the bushel by which the bontents of such chaldron are to be ascertained, is hereby repealed.

II. From and after the passing of this Act the chaldron of coal shall Chaldron defined ontain thirty-six imperial or Winchester bushels.

III. Hereafter no tub or other measure shall be used for the purpose Coal measures If measuring coal which shall not have been previously inspected by must be in-spected and one one of the Inspectors of Weights and Measures appointed under stamped. he Acts in force in Lower Canada relating to the inspection of weights nd measures, and by him stamped or branded with the proper mark, fer having been first compared and verified with and by the copies of he standard of the imperial bushel or half bushel provided by law for hat purpose; And all the provisions of the said Acts with respect to Inspection respection and the enforcing thereof shall apply to the measures used Lawsto apply. or the measurement of coal.

IV. And for the benefit and advantage of those engaged in the Consignee iv. And for the benefit and advantage of those engaged in the bound to pland navigation of Lower Canada; — Whenever any sailing vessel receive goods hall have arrived at its destination and the master thereof or his agent consigned hall have notified the person to whom the freight is consigned or his within a cergent, that such freight has reached the place designated in the bill of tain time. iding, the person to whom the freight is consigned shall be bound to eceive the same within twenty-four hours after notice to that effect shall ave been given to him.

V. If the consignee shall after the said delay refuse or neglect to see Penaltyfor not the discharging of such freight, he shall in such case be bound to doing so. By to the master or owner of such vessel at the rate of ten cents per
