of, by an Act passed in the Twenty-leventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repealing the several Duties of Customs and Excise, and granting other Duties in lieu thereof, and for other Purposes; and in case such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, shall not be valued according to the true and real Value thereof, and according to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, then it shall be lawful for the proper Officer or Officers of the Customs to cause the same to be detained, and the said Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be dealt with, and the proper Officers of the Customs shall proceed in every Respect in the Manner prescribed in such Case by the said recited Act.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That if upon the Importation of If the real any Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, on which the new and additional be afcertained Duties of Customs hereby imposed are charged in the Table hereunto without the annexed, marked (A.), according to the Value thereof, the Importer or Proprietor of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, his known Agent examined, a or Factor, shall not be able to make an Entry of such Goods, Wares, Deposit to fecure the new Duties the same being landed and arguments. In the same being landed and arguments first Important Proprietor. the same being landed and examined, such Importer, Proprietor, Agent, may be made, or Factor, shall, upon making Oath before the Collector or Comptroller of the Customs at the Port of Importation, that he is not enabled to Duties to be compared to the control of the Customs at the Port of Importation, that he is not enabled to Duties to be ascertain the true and real Value thereof in the Manner herein-before paid before Delivery of prescribed, be at Liberty to make a Deposit sufficient to secure the new the Goods; and additional Duties hereby imposed, and the Value of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, shall in such Case, as soon as may be after the Examination thereof, be ascertained by the Declaration of such Importer, Proprietor, Agent, or Factor, in the Manner and subject to the Rules, Regulations, Forfeitures, and Penalties, herein-before directed, and the faid new and additional Duties shall be paid (except as herein-after is provided) before the Delivery of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize; and if the Value of any fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, imported into and if their this Kingdom, cannot, after Examination thereof, be ascertained, so as to Value cannot be ascertained enable the Importer or Proprietor thereof, or his known Agent or Factor, without being to make an Entry according to the true and real Value thereof, without fold, they may be delivered the faid Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, being publickly fold, and the for that Purfame shall be made appear to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His pose on Pay-Majesty's Customs, or any Three or more of them, in England or Scotland former Durespectively, the said Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, after Payment of ties, etc. the Duties charged thereon by any former Act or Acts of Parliament in Force, on or immediately before the passing of this 'Act, shall and may be delivered for the Purpose of being so publickly sold, such Deposit being made as aforefaid, and the Entry of fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall in such Case be completed within Seven Days after such Sale, and the new and additional Duties hereby imposed shall be paid upon the Value thereof, according to the Price at which fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall have been so publickly sold, without any Abatement or Deduction whatever, except of so much as the Duties payable on the Importation thereof, by this or any other Act of Parliament, shall amount to, such Price to be ascertained by the Oath of the Importer or Proprietor of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or of his known Agent or Factor, before the Collector or Comptroller of the Customs at the Port of Importation: Provided always, That nothing in this Act shall Duties not extend, or be construed to extend, to charge with the new and additional to extend to
