An Act to enable Joseph Anctil, of Ste. Anne la Pocatière, and Auguste Fournier, of St Jean Port Joly, to be admitted to practise as Notaries in Lower Canada.

WHEREAS Joseph Ancul, of Ste. Anne la Pocatière, in the Preamble District of Kamouraska. in this Province, did not comply with all the requirements of Section sixteen of the seventy third Chapter of the Consolidated Statutes for Lower Canada, previous to commencing 5 his clerkship, and hath prayed to be admitted to an examination for the purpose of being admitted as Notary, notwithstanding the said provisions, and it is expedient to grant his prayer; and whereas Auguste Fournier. of St. Jean Port Joly, in the County of l'Islet, in this Province, has not been legally admitted to the study of the profession of 10 Notary. on account of there not being a quorum of the Board of Notaries before which he presented himself, and whereas he has not caused to be registered all his articles of clerkship as required by Section sixteen of the seventy third Chapter of the Consolidated Statutes for Lower Canada, and has prayed to be admitted to an examination for his admission 15 to the said profession of Notary in Lower Canada, notwithstanding the aforesaid defect in his articles of clerkship, and it is expedient to accede to his prayer: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Counneil and Assembly of Canada. enacts as

follows :

20 I. After the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for any Board of J. Anctul and Notaries in Lower Canada within whose jurisdiction they shall be, to A. Formier admit the said Joseph Anctil and Auguste Fournier to practise as mitted to Notaries, provided that they prove to the satisfaction of such Board practise as that they have studied with a practising Notary duly commissioned in Notaries

25 and for Lower Canada, during the period of time required by law, and provided also that they are deemed duly qualified after undergoing the examinations required of Candidates for admission to the practise of the said profession, notwithstanding any law or usage to the contrary.

80 2 This Act shall be deemed a public Act.
