students support an athletic fund. He says that before any action can be taken "we need to find out specifically whether people are interested."

The referendum asking students if they would approve of a \$35 fee increase to cover a more comprehensive health care plan

produced an affirmative majority; however, MacGee feel it was "not an overwhelming 'yes'."

As the Saint John campus has not yet held a similar referendum, it is not yet known whether the Direct-Paid health plan will be instituted for next year. MacGee says the decision will be made after the U.N.B.S.J. results have been tabulated, and plans can be worked out with the University's administration.

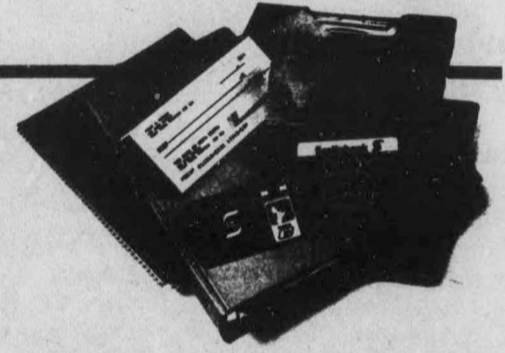
