Now this farm was like Crofton and Shantz and I understand it was passed at the last meeting of Parliament, but so far I have not heard anything about it from the Farmers' Credit Board. I was wondering if you could help me as I cannot ask the present government to do anything.

The interest will only leave me Two Hundred Dollars a year to live on for I do not make my living from the store, in fact I can hardly keep going and if I tried to sell it I would get hardly any thing for it. The reason I have kept it at all was that the Doctors and my lawyer made me go back so that I would have something to occupy my time. Since the death of my husband I have had
