## RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES.

The receipts from store sales and periodicals were \$8792.25, from colporteurs' sales \$15,786.34, from donations \$6241.66. from other sources including balance, \$222.90; making a total of \$32,299.77.

On the other hand we have paid for publications \$14,314.72, for colportage \$8227.12, for duty \$1599.50; all other expenditures per Treasurer's account \$8139.70; making a total of \$32,281.04, and leaving a balance of \$18.34.
