The Village of Beamsville will entertain its returned soldiers to a public banquet on Thursday evening, May 1st.

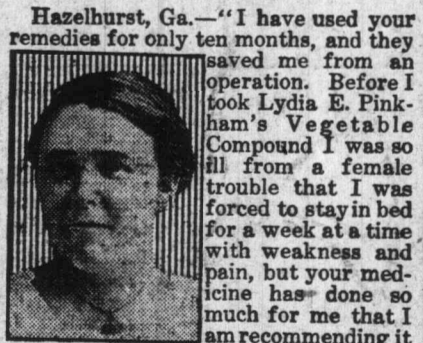
WAR DOG COMES TO TORONTO HOME

Robbers get Away With big sum from Ohio Bank Vault.

Upper Sandusky, O., April 25.—Robbers entered the Harper bank of Harper, near here, early this morning and escaped with over \$100,000 in Liberty bonds and other valuables taken from safety deposit boxes.

The three safes containing the bank's money and securities were not touched. The bonds and valuables taken belonged to customers of the bank. Doors to the vaults containing the safety boxes were cut open by acetylene torches. The robbers escaped in automobiles.
